Launch your global career

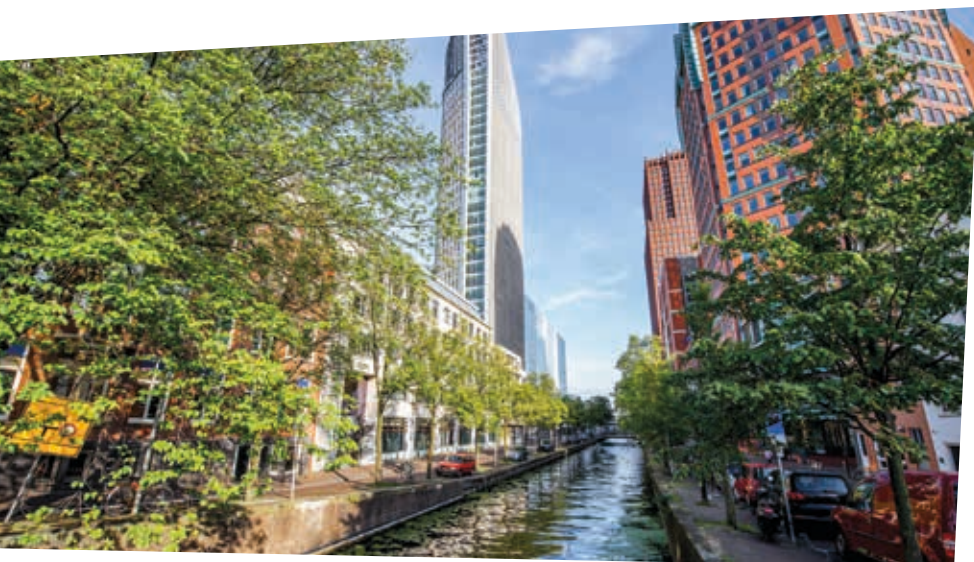

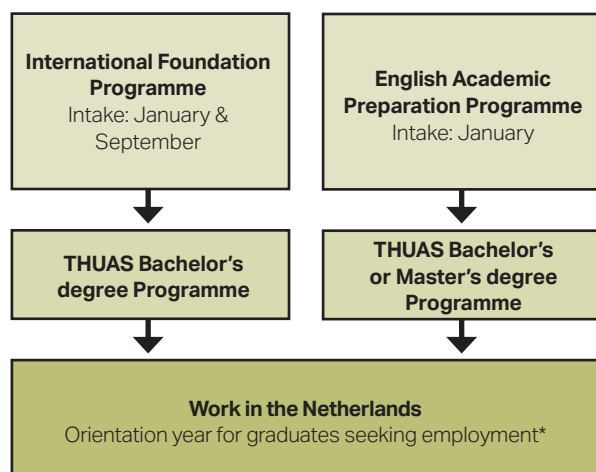
