Post-study work visa

The Netherlands allows graduates to apply for the Orientation Year (Zoekjaar) Permit after they have completed their studies. This enables recent graduates to stay for a further 12 months.



The Hague: City of peace and justice

The Hague (Den Haag), welcomes people from all over the world to work together on solutions to global problems. With the Peace Palace at the centre of it all, The Hague is truly an international city of peace and justice. It is a cosmopolitan city that attracts over 40,000 students, making it truly diverse. THUAS is located in the heart of the city centre, allowing students to get an all-round student experience.

You'll never run out of things to do in The Hague:

- Head to the beach, just a short bike 15-minute ride from the city centre
- View the artwork of Dutch masters at the 30+ museums or watch a performance by a nationally renowned theatre company
- Visit the bustling public outdoor markets offering local foods, antiques, books and goods
- Sample Dutch food favorites or visit one of the popular international restaurants or takeaway shops.

Travel across Europe and beyond

Your student visa will grant you the unique opportunity to travel through Europe during your studies. Hop on a train and you'll be in Amsterdam in under an hour, Paris in four hours and Brussels in just over two hours.

Employment options during your studies

During your studies, you are allowed to work up to 16 hours a week or full-time during your summer holidays. After graduating, you are eligible to stay for one year applying for jobs thanks to the Netherlands' Orientation Year for Graduates Seeking Employment.

Tips

- It is quicker to call the accommodation provider instead of emailing
- · The faster you respond, the more likely you will get the room
- Always pay attention to whether the offer is genuine, even though scams are relatively uncommon
